Treasure in Greek: θησαυρός, thēsauros, thaysow-ros' ; a deposit, that is, wealth (literally or figuratively): - treasure. 1 Timothy 6:17 (Page 841) Wealth and Hope. What I hope for is my treasure or wealth. What do I hope for?

Vs. 18 Rich in Goodness, Generosity and Sharing.

A problem from birth. Need a reprograming of our sinful nature into our heavenly nature.

Vs. 19 Treasures that last

Matthew 6:19-21

"Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moths and vermin destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where moths and vermin do not destroy, and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also."

Vs. 20-21 Guarding what's entrusted to you. Matthew 25:24-30

Jerimiah 17:5-11 Listen to and reflect on the passage.

- What do I hope for? (Hope linked to treasure)
- What are my riches? (Material or eternal)
- Where are you investing? (Will your treasures last?)
- What are you guarding? (Burying or planting)

1 Corinthians 3:12-15

12 Now if anyone builds on the foundation with gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, straw— 13 each one's work will become manifest, for the Day will disclose it, because it will be revealed by fire, and the fire will test what sort of work each one has done. 14 If the work that anyone has built on the foundation survives, he will receive a reward. 15 If anyone's work is burned up, he will suffer loss, though he himself will be saved, but only as through fire.
